

Split Commission Referral Scheme T&Cs

Achisomoch (AAC)'s Split Commission referral scheme provides charities with the opportunity to generate additional funds for themselves by recommending their donors to open an AAC account.

When a recommended donor is accepted by AAC as new account holder, the referring charity will receive 50% of commissions levied on all donations made into the donor's AAC account during the first two years that the account is open.

The split commission of 50% will be paid bi-annually to the charity on or around Jewish New Year & Passover.

In order to comply with GDPR, AAC will not share any personal data relating to the donor details with the referring charity. Moreover, AAC will only be able to pay commission to the referring the charity once AAC has accepted two or more new donors from that referring charity.

In order to be eligible for this scheme, the following terms must be met:

- A charity can only refer a donor through the 'Introduce new donors' section on the charity portal.
- The referral charity must at all times be a UK registered charity meeting all requirements of both the Charity Commissioners and the Information Commissioner and meet accord with AAC's compliance requirements.
- Only donors who open an AAC account in full accordance with the instructions set out in the referral email created by AAC and using the unique reference, within 30 days of receiving the email will be taken into account under this scheme.
- If a donor receives referral emails from more than one charity it will be at the discretion of AAC as to which charity, shall benefit under this scheme and then only if the donor has used the reference number linked to the application.
- The scheme is only available for new donors. A new donor is someone who has not held an AAC account in the three years immediately prior to the referral being received by AAC.

The following conditions apply:

- If a charity fails to comply with any of the above provisions and has not been resolved to the satisfaction of AAC within a period of one month, AAC reserve the right to terminate the participation of that charity in the scheme and no further commission will be shared.

- AAC will pay the charity the split commission for a two-year period commencing from the date on which the donor opens their AAC account by making a deposit with AAC, unless otherwise agreed by the parties in writing.
- AAC reserves the right to vary the level of charges and the rate of commission(s) shared at its discretion.
- In event of any dispute between the referring charity and AAC the dispute will be considered upon receipt of written submission by the charity by AAC Trustees whose decision will be final and binding on the parties.
- AAC reserves the right to refuse to open or maintain accounts for any donor without stating the reason to either the donor or the referring charity
- This scheme supersedes any previous schemes offered by AAC to charities to participate in commission sharing. AAC reserves the right to make changes to future iterations of the scheme without prior notice. AAC reserves to withdraw or amend this scheme on 30 days written notice
